



#### **CERVICAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH**

Sorors, did you know that nearly 13,000 women in the United States are diagnosed with cervical cancer each year and that the disease is virtually always preventable with proper screening and vaccination? Screening can occur anytime; however, scheduling a screening during the month of January is a great time to monitor the health of one's cervix. With so many women setting health goals at the onset of 2017, getting that cervical examination should be one of them since January has been designated by the United States Congress as Cervical

At one point cervical cancer was one of the leading forms of cancer, causing the deaths of many women. According to the American Cancer Society, the cervical cancer death

rate has gone down by more than 50% in the past 30 years. This decline is due to the increased use of screening tests. Screening can find changes in the cervix before cancer develops. It can also find cervical cancer early. Cervical cancer screenings can help detect abnormal (changed) cells early, before they turn into cancer. Most deaths from cervical cancer could be prevented by regular Pap tests and follow-up care.

One way to combat or prevent cervical cancer in the future is to have both adults and children vaccinated against human papilloma virus (HPV), which causes most cases of cervical cancer. HPV is a very common infection that spreads through sexual activity. It's also a

major cause of cervical cancer. Both boys and girls need the vaccine.

Let us take action today and spread the words of awareness and prevention throughout our communities and families regarding cervical cancer. Here are few things that we can do:

- Tweet, post, and broadcast on YouTube, Periscope and Facebook about Cervical Health Awareness Month.
- Add a badge from a health website that informs on the issue to your website.






